We are really pleased with the teaching and the leadership of the school. The parent zoom meeting was superb and we would like to thank the teachers for their dedication.	
The school is fantastic, I cannot fault it in any way. My son is so happy there and can't wait to go every day.	
Communication is awful. We always find out about events, trips or anything which needs paying for too late. Giving a monthly newsletter at the start of each month would be helpful to give parents 4 weeks to plan.	We have worked hard to improve communication over the last few years and feel that we have made huge strides in this. The weekly newsletter that goes out has a 'Looking Ahead' section on each week, which details the events coming up. This is to give parents time to plan ahead if there is any payments needed or if they need to arrange time off work for an event.
Homework has been too much at times.	As always, homework causes conflicting responses and there are as many people who think there is too much as too little. We try and ensure that we have a balanced view to homework and find a middle ground that is manageable for everyone.
Homework – too little, more needed.	
My child has come home with her t shirt on inside out or looking untidy after PE. I would like teachers to help out	We understand that children may not always be as neat and tidy when they leave school as they were



with this.	when they entered it, but we take that as a sign of a good day! In terms of getting dressed after PE, we do encourage children to develop their self-care skills as part of their development especially as this is an area of learning, and sometimes this may result in the odd inside out t shirt, especially when we are trying to help 30 children! Bear with them whilst they are developing these life skills!
The school has improved massively over the last couple of years and the standard of teaching is very high. I am really happy that my children love this school. Thank you	
I do have some disagreements regarding the children's reading. I agree with daily reading however having to read the same book repeatedly all week becomes boring and affects their love of reading.	Unfortunately, the current situation with Covid has restricted the number of times a book can be changed, due to the need to quarantine books when they come back to school. However, to combat this we have purchased Reading Eggs and a KS2 online library, and sign post parents to resources such as Oxford Owl, where children are able to access thousands of books to support them in developing their reading.
Certain school fundraising projects which are scams really (like Young writers' competition) are a bit disappointing.	Unfortunately, fundraising is necessary for us to make the improvements that we need in school and to provide our pupils with the best learning opportunities and environment that we can. We try our best to ensure that fundraising is child focused, and that children get something from whatever we do. The Young Writers competition was not a fundraising event; it was simply an activity to increase excitement about writing and an opportunity for the children to enter their writing with the chance of it being published.
I fell in love with this school during open evening last year and have fell even more so since she started in September.	
I would like the children to do a similar questionnaire to see how they feel also.	All children complete a pupil questionnaire each year too. We will share the results of this once we have the pupils back in and can share it with them.
In general, I've seen a big improvement in teaching in the last 3 years. Much better teachers and a better, more focused strategy.	

We are pleased to see that nearly all the responses were so positive, and that very few development points were raised have all been included above. Can I remind all parents/carers, that if you have any concerns, there are a number of avenues that you can go down to address them. Your first port of call in the class teacher, who will hopefully be able to solve any concerns that you have. If not, there are two Assistant Headteachers - Miss Parkinson in the infants, and Mr Adam in the Juniors - both of whom are available to speak to parents at the start/end of the day.

If you feel that your concern has not been addressed, or that it is more serious or confidential than addressing with the class teacher, please feel free to call the office to make an appointment to see me. In most instances I can see parents the same day, and concerns can be addressed quickly.
