


Reception knowledge Organiser - People Who Help Us

Key facts/skills:

Learn the names of different occupations

Describe how some roles help our community

Key areas of development: Prime areas

Within this topic, children will have visits from people working in different job roles. This therefore provides the opportunity for the children to become more confident in new and different social situations. Children will also learn about appropriate questions and create their own to ask the visitors, therefore developing their knowledge within this topic. To conclude, children will use what they have learned to express which job role they might to do when they are old and justify their choice during a circle time.

Key areas of development: Mathematics

Children will continue to learn a number a week and will now be very familiar with different representations of numerals, e.g. tally marks, ten frames and manipulatives.

Children will now start to use this knowledge to explore composition.

Key areas of development: Literacy

During this topic, the children will engage with a range of book centred writing activities, such as creating a wanted poster to help the police find Burglar Bill and writing an accident report for Humpty Dumpty! As well as exploring these named characters, the children will also draw a picture of themselves their chosen career/job. The most exciting writing opportunity during this topic takes place when we learn about the postal service, as this includes writing our own letters.. including one to Father Christmas!

Key areas of development: EAD/UTW

At the start of this topic, the role play area will become a police station, before turning into a magical post office in December! A key creative challenge that the children will be given is to create their own mode of transport for the emergency services, e.g. a fire engine or ambulance. This is a very exciting home project which provides the opportunity for children to both share and acquire new knowledge about 'People who help us' at home.

Experiences/Visitors/Projects

Different visitors will come into school this half term, including a police man, local fireservice and our school nurse. Combining this topic with Christmas, children will learn about the postal service and will write and post their own letters to Father Christmas
